Scientists used the samples, videos, and other data to expand our knowledge of living things in the Arctic Ocean. They learned that **zooplankton**, tiny animals that other ocean animals eat, could live more than a mile below the ocean's icy surface. They also encountered jellyfish, sea stars, an octopus they named Oliver, and **crustaceans** with legs and antennae similar to lobsters, shrimps, and crabs in the Arctic's **frigid** waters. The scientists noticed many plants and animals actually live in the sea ice. Team members might have discovered several new **species** of ocean animals—including three new species of bristle worm. By finding a wider range of plant and animal life than expected, the scientists learned more about the Arctic food web. Their work answered many questions about the Arctic.
